 - Birth Certificate
 - PEI Health Card
 - Passport
- Verification of home address must also be provided, such as current utility bill.
- Welcome to Kindergarten sessions for incoming students and their parents will be held at schools in the spring of 2022.

Please keep in mind that:


- Parents are reminded to wear a mask at the school when registering their child.
